
EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

#### 2021/2022 HIGHLIGHTS - PROJECT MANAGER

PROJECT MANAGER

O ur project year 2021/22 will always be remembered as a journey of reemergence. After a devastating twelvemonth cycle of pandemic lockdown and restrictions, our community demonstrated so much resilience but also a resolve to get their lives back to approaching normal.

At Enlighten, our project staff remained committed to weather the storm and adjust project plans as necessary while schools tried to make up for lost time. As schools re-opened, we observed the emotional toll that the pandemic had taken on children. As one of our staff described it, "children were not as talkative or energetic as we had become accustomed to".

When a further wave of the virus was declared and schools once again closed and re-opened, the Trust adapted its activities and facilities accordingly. For example, we were able to successfully step up our inhouse programmes and facilitate increased numbers of learners by enlarging the spaces available for e-Learning, Toy Therapy and Toy Library. I am particularly proud of our new ECD model classroom providing a vital boost to our teacher development work.

Enlighten management reached out to other service providers in the early childhood space to share experiences as we emerged from the pandemic. A very fruitful visit was conducted to the True North ECD support organisation in Muizenberg where we learned about their experience in the management of a large number of Educare centres similar to our own case-load in the Overstrand.

A memorable highlight during the year was the School Readiness initiative for families with the aim of greater parental involvement in preparing Grade R learners for entry to Grade 1.


We witnessed a significant growth in

the number of children accessing our e-Learning activities while children from our music project made successful radio and tv appearances during the year. The year ended with an extraordinary Art Exhibition where our learners demonstrated their enormous creativity with many selling their art-work following a well-attended exhibition.

In summary, we have been through an unprecedented period in the 20-year history of our organisation. I am pleased

to say that our community responded admirably by engaging with us and availing of opportunities to ensure that children could resume their education and lead normal lives again.

Thank you to all our staff who worked tirelessly under difficult circumstances in the service of our parents, teachers and learners. Finally, I also wish to thank our Board and Executive Director for their understanding and guidance throughout the year.

# **RESULTS FOR THE** YEAR 2021/22

#### TEACHER DEVELOPMENT



R esearch shows that good quality early childhood education is critical in helping a child develop the social, emotional and cognitive skills they need to prepare for life in education and beyond. Early Childhood Development is a corner-stone of the work of Enlighten. In addition to Teacher Professional Development, the project offers a School Readiness Parental Programme as well as support for Registration of edu-care centres (ECD centres). This is complemented by the Enlighten Book and Toy libraries that provide vital learning materials.

During the year, teachers from 30 ECD centres benefitted from training modules on how to manage their facilities and make best use of the resources at their disposal. Some 127 teachers participated in six well-attended Theme workshops. In addition, the Trust established a model, state of the art ECD classroom at its headquarters in Mount Pleasant to be used as a training laboratory for teachers.

Work continued to support ECD centres with registration submissions to the Western Cape Department of Social Development (DSD). Service providers in the sector face many challenges with regard to local planning regulations, for example zoning, health and safety and fire clearance. A possible solution on the horizon is the newly launched Vangasali project ('no child should be left behind') of the DSD and Overstrand Municipality. Enlighten was invited to participate in the project that aims to simplify the standards required for previously unregistered ECD centres. The good news is that six ECD's in Zwelihle accommodating 200 children have been awarded a 'Bronze' status certificate on meeting the new minimum requirements to operate and most importantly to apply for much-needed local Government funding.

Notwithstanding the different Covid-related restrictions in place during the year, 134 parents attended a series of workshops at which they were trained by 12 educators in the application of the Mandjie project, a School Readiness initiative for family and community. The objective of this project is to prepare Grade R learners to be school ready when they enter Grade 1, by assisting parents to strengthen the formal Gr R programme through playing at home.

As the community emerged from the worst effects of the pandemic, the project provided food parcels to very needy parents and personal protective equipment was delivered to 14 ECD centres.



#### LITERACY AND NUMERACY

The improvement of literacy (reading and writing) and numeracy of learners particularly in Grades R and 1 remains a central pillar in the work of Enlighten. During the year, the Foundation Phase Enrichment Programme achieved commendable results notwithstanding the disruption caused by Covid. The programme follows a multi-faceted approach embracing learners, parents and teachers.

The project, designed in part by an occupational therapist, was offered in four primary schools in the Overberg, namely Hawston, Mount Pleasant, Gansbaai and Kleinmond. All of the carefully selected 312 learners made progress to varying degrees. Information workshops were held for parents and 24 teachers received support to improve their skills. During lockdown, the programme team produced informative videos and PowerPoint courses on social media. Stories abound about children who have benefitted considerably from the programme and one-on-one intervention.



A complementary **Play Therapy pilot project** aims to assist learners, through play, to fill gaps in their skills so as to better cope with school work in the Foundation Phase. Initial results are promising as learners can be seen making progress in reading, writing and numeracy.



The **Enlighten Library** based at the organisation's headquarters is a major learning resource for the local community with a collection of almost 15,000 books in all the country's official languages catalogued on its shelves. The library has a membership of 7,352 and pandemic restrictions aside, up to 50 children can visit on a daily basis. Support is on hand to assist the child with either paired or shared reading. Otherwise, books may be taken on loan – a scheme that has a very high return rate. A Children's Book Network interactive workshop (Theme: 'Imagination') was attended by 27 children from neighbouring schools. According to the lead facilitator the children really enjoyed being temporarily transported into a world of fantasy. The library's outreach activities visited 3 schools in the community where 281 children were reached. As part of an ongoing outreach project, the library also distributed 1,362 Book Dash books to Foundation Phase learners in schools in the Overberg. To further stimulate the children, the library encourages the playing of chess and cards in its rooms on Fridays. Assistance with homework is also available and parents are encouraged to visit the premises and interact with the teaching staff.




By way of complement to its Literacy activities, Enlighten hosts a chapter of the award-winning **Shine Literacy project**. During the year, with the help of a team of 11 volunteers, the project provided shared and paired reading and writing support to 19 children from Foundation to Grade 2. In addition, resource packs were provided including "Little Issue", pencils, drawing books, erasers and Book Dash books.

In response to the needs of the community, the Trust has undertaken a specific Afrikaans literacy initiative to assist non-South Africans and Xhosa speaking learners at Hawston and Mount Pleasant primary schools to understand and read Afrikaans which is the language of learning and teaching at those schools. Support with reading and comprehension was also provided to a small number of Afrikaans speaking learners who have fallen behind in their mother tongue.











### TOOLS FOR LEARNING & LIFE SKILLS

igital learning is increasingly becoming a focus in Government education policy and consequently Enlighten has steadily developed its activities in this area. In the year under review, while the pandemic curbed the level of activity that was possible, much was achieved by the Enlighten E-Learning project. Some 38 educators benefitted from Teacher Professional Development training on how to improve learning and teaching through effective use of information technology (IT). A further two educators benefitted from IT skills upgrading in relation to robotics while an additional four received support with accessing and utilising the on-line literacy and numeracy learning site LitNum. Enlighten's digital team worked in 8 primary schools and 2 ECD centres in the Overberg to demonstrate the application of IT tools in boosting literacy and numeracy. Some 1,216 learners have benefitted from this initiative. When regulations permitted it, as many as 500

leaners were able to use the Trust's digital laboratory to improve their skills, conduct internet research and to complete homework assignments.

Enlighten's Toy Library has been growing in popularity since 2015. Educational toys have proven to be excellent tools for learning. They help children develop problem solving skills, teach about conflict resolution and help with the development of fine and gross motor skills. The library caters for children from 2 months to 13 years of age. Each week about 325 children from 27 pre-schools in Mount Pleasant, Zwelihle, Hawston, Bosko and Kleinmond use the facility while toys are loaned out to 18 edu-care centres in the same communities. World Play day was marked on 28 May 2021 with a special event attended by forty 4-5 year- old children from neighbourhood schools. A successful component of the project has been the lending of toys for use at home one that is much appreciated by parents.

Despite all the restrictions on gatherings, the past year has been a major success for the Trust's **Music project**. All of the 19 students entered in the UNISA music exams (piano, violin, violoncello) achieved distinctions while four learners were placed on the UNISA Roll of Honour. Two school marimba bands (Botrivier and Hermanus Waldorf) took part in the International Education Africa Marimba and Steelpan Festival while the Botrivier marimba band performed on Western Cape radio and television. As various festivals were cancelled, the music department of Enlighten organised its own internal concerts and competitions with quality prizes. Interest in the music project is growing in the local school community which is a very positive sign given the many educational benefits including language acquisition and brain development in general.



My name is **Natasha**, I am 10 years old. I started playing music when I was in Grade 2. I love my music lessons very much. I play the soprano recorder. I also have a guitar and a keyboard. Teacher Sarah is amazing and is a caring human being. We love our concerts at Enlighten and we play for the Old Age Homes in Hermanus. I also participated in the Eisteddfod where I received a Gold diploma. My dream is to become a star one day, playing all kinds of instruments.









My name is **Mbali Lifaba**. I am 11 years old. I started coming to the Enlighten Education Trust when I was very young when I was in Grade R. I started coming to the library first, to take out books and that was when my mother found out about the music classes that Enlighten offered for little children.

I chose to learn to play the violin together with my cousin Ayanda and we have been learning together since we were 6 years old. And we are still learning together and enjoying the classes. We even get to go to fun concerts with other children. One of the other things I love at Enlighten is when I get to do my homework and when I do not understand, there is somebody close by to help. Form Mondays to Thursday aunty Elmine, our librarian and Sisipho, my big sister who assists aunty Elmine, make sure we read books and do our homework. On Fridays, we can draw, play games and colour in. We play chess and build puzzles. We have a lot of fun. And we also get sandwiches.

Enlighten Education Trust makes children smart and keep them safe.

#### Love, Mbali

Visual Arts & Crafts is the fourth strand of Enlighten's tools for learning programme. On a very positive note, the facilitators of the project reported a noticeable improvement in the all-round academic performance of the students taking part. Two classes per week were offered to ten Grade 8-11 learners aimed at empowerment, skills development and the development of personal expression. Practical lessons were delivered on presenting art, exhibiting and selling of their work. Guest artists were invited to give demonstrations and to provide inspiration to the learners. An annual art exhibition permitted the students to offer their paintings for sale. Educational



trips to art galleries in Hermanus increased the learners' exposure to the art world. A second group of ten younger learners from Grade 1-7 were introduced to fundamental art skills. Notable successes from the senior cohort were that four of the group exhibited their work in Hermanus during the Night of 1,000 Drawings. One learner received a private commission for artwork while two learners were selected for internships at a commercial gallery in Hermanus.

Meanwhile, in an effort to address the challenge of the pandemic restrictions, the two facilitators created teaching videos for the Western Cape Education Department (WCED) to assist both teachers and learners. The videos were also made available through Google classroom to Enlighten learners.

A new addition to the Trust's portfolio is a series of **Life Skills Camps** for Grade 8 and 9 learners. The key objective is to provide social and psychological support and to improve the self-esteem of learners at risk. Four camps were successfully carried out during the year with a total 137 learners. Positive feedback was received from teachers and principals.


